El Shaddai is a Hebrew name for God that is found throughout the Bible. It is often translated as "God Almighty" or "God of the Mountains" and is used to refer to God's power and might. The name El Shaddai appears in the Old Testament more than 40 times and is used to describe God's power and authority.

Genesis

The first time El Shaddai is used in the Bible is in Genesis 17:1, when God appears to Abraham and says, "I am El Shaddai; walk before me and be blameless." This is the first time God reveals himself to Abraham and it is a powerful reminder of God's power and authority.

Exodus

The name El Shaddai is also used in the book of Exodus. Numbers

The name El Shaddai is also used in the book of Numbers. In Numbers 24:4, Balaam says, "God is not a man, that he should lie, nor a son of man, that he should change his mind. Has he said, and will he not do it? Or has he spoken, and will he not fulfill it?" This is a reminder that God is powerful and faithful and that he will keep his promises.

Deuteronomy

The name El Shaddai is also used in the book of Deuteronomy. In Deuteronomy 10:17, Moses says, "For the Lord your God is God of gods and Lord of lords, the great, the mighty, and the awesome God, who is not partial and takes no bribe." This is a reminder that God is powerful and just and that he will not be swayed by bribes or partiality.

Psalms

The name El Shaddai is also used in the book of Psalms. In Psalm 68:14, the psalmist says, "When the Almighty scattered the kings in the land, it was like snowflakes falling on Zalmon." This is a reminder that God is powerful and that he can scatter even the mightiest of kings.

Isaiah

The name El Shaddai is also used in the book of Isaiah. In Isaiah 45:11, God says, "Thus says the Lord, the Holy One of Israel, and its Maker: Ask me of things to come; will you command me concerning my children and the work of my hands?" This is a reminder that God is powerful and that he is in control of all things.
