



Communication breakdown in the family

Description

The tongue is set among our members, staining the whole body, setting on fire the entire course of life, and set on fire by hell." • This verse shows that words can have a powerful and lasting effect.

3. The Need for Understanding

The Bible also emphasizes the need for understanding in communication. Proverbs 18:13 says, "If one gives an answer before he hears, it is his folly and shame." • This verse shows that it is important to listen before speaking. Proverbs 17:27-28 says, "Whoever restrains his words has the knowledge, and he who has a cool spirit is a man of understanding. Even a fool who keeps silent is considered wise; when he closes his lips, he is deemed intelligent." • This verse shows that it is important to think before speaking and to be slow to anger.

4. The Need for Respect

The Bible also emphasizes the need for respect in communication. Ephesians 4:32 says, "Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you." • This verse shows that communication should be kind and respectful, not harsh and abrasive. Colossians 3:12-13 says, "Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive." • This verse shows that communication should be forgiving and understanding, not judgmental and critical.

5. The Need for Love

Finally, the Bible emphasizes the need for love in communication. 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 says, "Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things." • This verse shows that communication should be loving and patient, not harsh and abrasive.
