

Contacts and Networking

## **Description**

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Building and nurturing relationships is essential in life, especially in your walk with Christ. Good connections can help you grow spiritually, professionally, and personally. Networking may sound like a business buzzword, but it's also a deeply biblical concept. Proverbs 27:17 says, "As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another." As Christians, we should actively engage in making meaningful contacts, both inside and outside of the church, to create opportunities for growth and service.

## 1. The Biblical Foundation of Relationships

When forming professional contacts, maintain integrity in all your interactions. Building trust is key, and as followers of Christ, we are called to act with honesty and transparency. Proverbs 11:3 states, "The integrity of the upright guides them, but the unfaithful are destroyed by their duplicity."

# 3. Building a Christ-Centered Network

A strong network is one that is centered around Christ. In your life and career, aim to build relationships with like-minded people who share your Christian values. This does not mean isolating yourself from non-believers, but rather ensuring that your core connections are rooted in faith.

Hebrews 10:24-25 reminds us, "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another." Being part of a supportive Christian network can encourage spiritual growth and accountability.

## 4. Serving Through Your Connections

Networking from a Christian perspective is not just about what you can gain, but how you can serve. God often places people in our lives for us to help them in some way. Philippians 2:4 teaches us, "Not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others."

When you see networking as an opportunity to serve, you'll be amazed at how God opens doors. Whether it's offering advice, sharing resources, or praying for someone, your network becomes a ministry where God's love is shared.

# 5. Trusting God to Lead Your Connections

Finally, trust that God is in control of your contacts and networking. Sometimes, we may worry about missed opportunities or connections that didn't go as planned, but Proverbs 3:5-6 encourages us, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."

God knows who you need in your life and at what time. Pray about your relationships and trust Him to bring the right people into your path. As you continue to build a network with a Christ-centered mindset, you'll find that God's plan for your connections is far better than anything you could have arranged on your own.
