

Examples of how the name Jehovah Jireh is used in the Bible

Jehovah Jireh is a name used in the Bible to refer to God as the provider of all things. It is derived from the Hebrew words *Yahweh* and *Yireh* which mean *the Lord will provide*. The name is used throughout the Bible to refer to God's provision for his people.

I. Examples of Jehovah Jireh in the Bible

A. Abraham and Isaac

One of the most well-known examples of Jehovah Jireh in the Bible is found in the story of Abraham and Isaac. In Genesis 22, God commands Abraham to sacrifice his son, Isaac, as a test of his faith. Abraham obeys and takes Isaac to the mountain to be sacrificed. Just as Abraham is about to sacrifice his son, God provides a ram for the sacrifice instead. C. Moses

The story of Moses is another example of Jehovah Jireh in the Bible. In Exodus 3, God commands Moses to lead the Israelites out of Egypt and into the Promised Land. As they are fleeing, God provides them with food, water, and protection

from their enemies. In this story, God is demonstrating his provision for his people and showing that he will provide for them in times of need.
