



Examples of how the name Prince of Peace is used in the Bible

The name “Prince of Peace” is used throughout the Bible to refer to Jesus Christ, the Son of God. In the Old Testament, the name is used to refer to the coming Messiah who will bring peace and salvation to the world. In the New Testament, the name is used to refer to Jesus’s role as the ultimate source of peace and reconciliation between God and humanity.

I. The Old Testament

A. Isaiah 9:6

The name “Prince of Peace” is first used in the Old Testament in Isaiah 9:6. In this passage, the prophet Isaiah foretells the coming of the Messiah who will bring peace and salvation to the world: “For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.”

B. Isaiah 11:1-5

The name “Prince of Peace” is also used in Isaiah 11:1-5. And his delight shall be in the fear of the Lord. He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide by what his ears hear; but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; and he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked. Righteousness shall be the belt of his waist, and faithfulness the belt of his loins.”

C. Zechariah 9:9-10

The name “Prince of Peace” is also used in Zechariah 9:9-10. In this passage, the prophet Zechariah foretells the coming of the Messiah who will bring peace and salvation to the world: “Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your king is coming to you; righteous and having salvation is he, humble and mounted on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey. I will cut off the chariot from Ephraim and the war horse from Jerusalem; and the battle bow shall be cut off, and he shall speak peace to the nations; his rule shall be from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth.”

II. The New Testament

A. Luke 2:14

The name “Prince of Peace” is also used in the New Testament in Luke 2:14. In this passage, the angel Gabriel announces the birth of Jesus to the shepherds: “Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!”

B. John 14:27

The name “Prince of Peace” is also used in John 14:27. In this passage, Jesus tells his disciples that he is the source of peace and reconciliation between God and humanity: “Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid.”

C. Ephesians 2:14-17

The name “Prince of Peace” is also used in Ephesians 2:14-17. In this passage, the apostle Paul explains how Jesus has brought peace and reconciliation between God and humanity: “For he himself is our peace, who has made us both one and has broken down in his flesh the dividing wall of hostility by abolishing the law of commandments expressed in ordinances, that he might create in himself one new man in place of the two, so making peace, and might reconcile us both to God in one body through the cross, thereby killing the hostility. And he came and preached peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near.”
