Redeemer is a term used in the Bible to refer to God or Jesus Christ. It is used to describe the act of God redeeming mankind from sin and death. confirmation in Israel” (Ruth 4:7). Boaz was a kinsman-redeemer, a relative who was responsible for redeeming the land and property of a relative who had died without an heir.

## **II. Redeemer in the New Testament**

In the New Testament, the term Redeemer is used to refer to Jesus Christ. In the book of Romans, Paul refers to Jesus as the Redeemer: “For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, being justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus” (Romans 3:23-24).

In the book of Galatians, Paul refers to Jesus as the Redeemer of those who have faith in Him: “Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the law, having become a curse for us (for it is written, ‘Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree’)” (Galatians 3:13).

## **III. Redeemer in the Book of Revelation**

The term Redeemer is also used in the book of Revelation to refer to Jesus Christ. In Revelation 5:9, Jesus is referred to as the Lamb of God who was slain and who has redeemed us from our sins: “And they sang a new song, saying: ‘You are worthy to take the scroll, and to open its seals; for You were slain, and have redeemed us to God by Your blood out of every tribe and tongue and people and nation’” (Revelation 5:9).

## **IV. Redeemer in Other Books of the Bible**

The term Redeemer is also used in other books of the Bible to refer to God or Jesus Christ. In the book of Psalms, God is referred to as the Redeemer of Israel: “He is the Lord our God; His judgments are in all the earth. He remembers His covenant forever, the word which He commanded, for a thousand generations” (Psalm 105:7-8).

In the book of Job, God is referred to as the Redeemer of mankind: “For I know that my Redeemer lives, and He shall stand at last on the earth; and after my skin is destroyed, this I know, that in my flesh I shall see God” (Job 19:25-26).
