Forgiveness of Sins through Jesus' Death on the Cross

Forgiveness of sins, the Bible also teaches that Jesus' death on the cross was a substitutionary sacrifice. In the book of Isaiah, God says, "He was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed" (Isaiah 53:5). This passage makes it clear that Jesus' death on the cross was a substitutionary sacrifice, meaning that he took the punishment for our sins so that we could be forgiven.

The Bible also teaches that Jesus' death on the cross was a once-for-all sacrifice. In the book of Hebrews, Paul writes, "But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, he sat down at the right hand of God" (Hebrews 10:12). This passage makes it clear that Jesus' death on the cross was a once-for-all sacrifice, meaning that it was sufficient to cover all of our sins.

But I believe that you died for my sins and rose again. I ask that you come into my heart and be my Lord. I commit to following you and living for you every day. Thank you for your love and for the gift of eternal life. In your name I pray, Amen. Amen
