



## How to Evangelise to a Spouse

### Description

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Sharing your faith with your spouse can be a deeply fulfilling journey, but it also requires sensitivity, respect, and love. As it says in 1 Peter 3:1, “Wives, in the same way, submit yourselves to your own husbands so that, if any of them do not believe the word, they may be won over without words by the behavior of their wives.” This verse highlights the importance of actions in evangelism, emphasizing that sometimes our behavior speaks louder than words.

Hebrews 10:24-25 encourages us, “And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together.”

Understand that faith is a personal journey, and everyone moves at their own pace. Respect your spouse’s feelings and questions, and be there to provide support and answers when they are ready. Galatians 6:9 encourages perseverance: “Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up.”

### **6. Use Scripture Wisely**

When sharing Bible verses, choose ones that speak to love, hope, and grace. Avoid using scripture to condemn or criticize. Instead, focus on verses that highlight God’s love and the gift of salvation, such as John 3:16, “For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.”
