

Maundy Thursday on Easter

Maundy Thursday is an important day in the Christian calendar, celebrated on the Thursday before Easter. It marks the day that Jesus celebrated the Last Supper with his disciples, and is a time of reflection and remembrance.

I. What is Maundy Thursday?

Maundy Thursday is the Thursday before Easter Sunday and is the day that Jesus celebrated the Last Supper with his disciples. It is also known as Holy Thursday, Covenant Thursday, Great and Holy Thursday, Sheer Thursday, and Thursday of Mysteries. The word "Maundy" comes from the Latin word "mandatum", which means "commandment". This is in reference to the commandment that Jesus gave to his disciples at the Last Supper: "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another" (John 13:34).

II. The Last Supper

The Last Supper was the last meal that Jesus shared with his disciples before his death. It is recorded in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke. During the meal,

Jesus gave his disciples a new commandment to love one another, and he also instituted the Eucharist, or Communion. He also predicted his betrayal by Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples. After the meal, Jesus and his disciples went to the Garden of Gethsemane, where Jesus was arrested.

III. The Meaning of Maundy Thursday

Maundy Thursday is a time of reflection and remembrance for Christians. It is a time to remember the sacrifice that Jesus made for us, and to reflect on the commandment that he gave us to love one another. It is also a time to remember the Last Supper and the institution of the Eucharist.

Maundy Thursday is typically celebrated with a special service in churches. During the service, the Eucharist is often celebrated, and the story of the Last Supper is often read. In some churches, the washing of feet is also practiced, in remembrance of Jesus washing the feet of his disciples at the Last Supper.
