Songs are also used to express praise and worship in Judaism. The most wellknown song is the Hallel, which is recited during the Passover Seder and other holidays. Other songs, such as the Shir HaMaalot, are used to express joy and gratitude to God.

Dance is also used to express praise and worship in Judaism. The most wellknown dance is the hora, which is performed during weddings and other joyous occasions. Other dances, such as the kabbalat shabbat, are used to welcome the Sabbath.
