The history of Israel before the Babylonian exile is an important part of the Christian faith. It is a story of God's faithfulness to His people, and of His promises to them. Abraham and his wife Sarah had a son, Isaac, and Isaac had two sons, Jacob and Esau. Jacob was later renamed Israel, and his descendants became known as the Israelites.

The Israelites were enslaved in Egypt for many years, but God sent Moses to lead them out of slavery and into the Promised Land of Canaan. The Israelites were led by Joshua, and they conquered the land of Canaan and settled there. The Israelites were ruled by judges and then by kings, and they were divided into two kingdoms, the northern kingdom of Israel and the southern kingdom of Judah.

The northern kingdom of Israel was conquered by the Assyrians in 722 BC, and the people were taken into exile. The southern kingdom of Judah was conquered by the Babylonians in 586 BC, and the people were taken into exile in Babylon. This exile lasted for 70 years, and during this time the Israelites were allowed to practice their religion and to keep their culture alive.

At the end of the exile, the Israelites were allowed to return to their homeland. This event is known as the Return from Exile, and it is celebrated in the Bible as a time of joy and redemption.
