Three times I was shipwrecked; a night and a day I was adrift at sea; on frequent journeys, in danger from rivers, danger from robbers, danger from my own people, danger from Gentiles, danger in the city, danger in the wilderness, danger at sea, danger from false brothers; in toil and hardship, through many a sleepless night, in hunger and thirst, often without food, in cold and exposure.â?•

Paulâ??s suffering was not in vain. He was able to use his experiences to relate to the persecuted church and to encourage them to remain faithful in the face of suffering.
